- France Vaillancourt for the HNHB region. Mrs Vaillancourt is currently the executive director at Community Living Grimsby-Lincoln, and was the deputy director at Centre de santé communautaire Hamilton-Niagara for 5 years prior to that. She also brings to the board 7 years experience with French language services planning and development at the Ontario Ministry of Jutice.
